




Amazon Purchases, \$ by Program








Specialty Bikes

The Buddy Bike – The Alternative Tandem Bicycle

Client has Epilepsy, Cerebral Palsy, hearing loss and moderate intellectual disabilities. He is unable to ride a bicycle by himself. His family moved to Denver from the Chicago area last summer. While in Chicago, his family was able to test ride a Buddy Bike Family Classic 7 speed, which is a tandem bicycle that the parent guides, steers and helps to pedal. The positioning of the child in front allows for the parent to sit very close with the parent's arms almost around the child, unlike a normal tandem bike. The family was able to ride the bike, and it worked very well. Client likes being able to do what his siblings do (he's a triplet). The Buddy Bike allows him to participate in family outings.







DDS

Disability Determination Services

State agency makes the disability determination for the federal Social Security Administration.

ILCs

Independent Living Center

Private, non-profit, community-based organizations that provide information and referral, peer counseling, independent living skills training, individual and systems advocacy for all disabilities across the life span starting at age five.

Medicaid

Public health insurance for people with physical and developmental disabilities and older adults (among others). Provides LTSS at home and in the community, as well as in institutions such as nursing homes, to eligible individuals.

Institution

HCBS Waiver

PACE

Home Health

ADRC

Aging and Disability Resources for Colorado

Streamlines access to LTSS information and services that allow people to remain as independent as possible.

CCBs

Community Centered Board

Private, non-profits designated in statute as the single entry-point into the LTSS system for people with developmental disabilities. Can also be a service provider.

SEPs

Single Entry Point

Entry points for potential Medicaid LTSS clients. Provide information, screening, assessment of need, and referral to appropriate programs. SEPs serve older adults and people with physical disabilities and mental health needs.

CDSS/CDHS

County Department of Social/Human Services

Local departments that provide financial eligibility determination for older adults, people with physical disabilities and mental health needs for Medicaid waivers and programs.

AAAs

Area Agency on Aging

Local programs that provide information and services on a range of assistance for older adults and those who care for them.

State Services

Services for older adults and people with physical disabilities with funding from the Older Americans Act and the Older Coloradans Act, administered through the Colorado Department of Human Services.






Siloed System

Single Entry Point (SEP)

- \$13 million annual state contract, renewable for five years, to be the single entry point for Adams, Arapahoe, Denver, Douglas and Elbert counties.
- Contract begins July 1, 2020.
- SEP work includes nearly 11,000 clients and 180 staff.



Legislative Update

End the Wait

Proposal to end the waiting list for DD services.

Proposed Solution

- Commit to a 6-year, phased-in elimination of the DD waiting list. In each of the next six years, Colorado should enroll 500 people (about one-sixth of the individuals) on the DD waiver's As Soon As Available waiting list; and
- Remove IDD rates from the common policy and tie future increases to the Denver-Aurora-Lakewood Consumer Price Index (CPI) to ensure the availability of providers to serve new and existing enrollees.
