Simplifying program to reflect two doors of access:

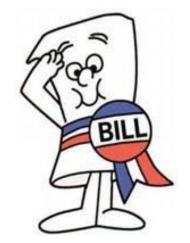

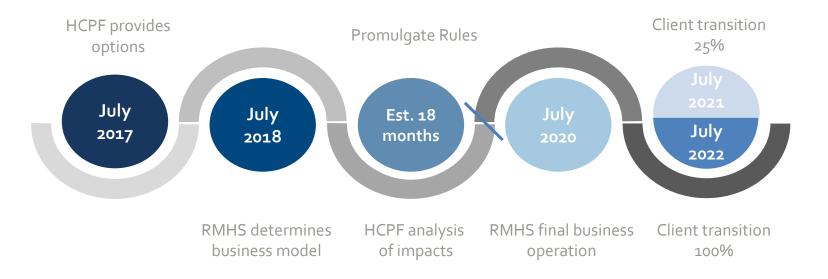


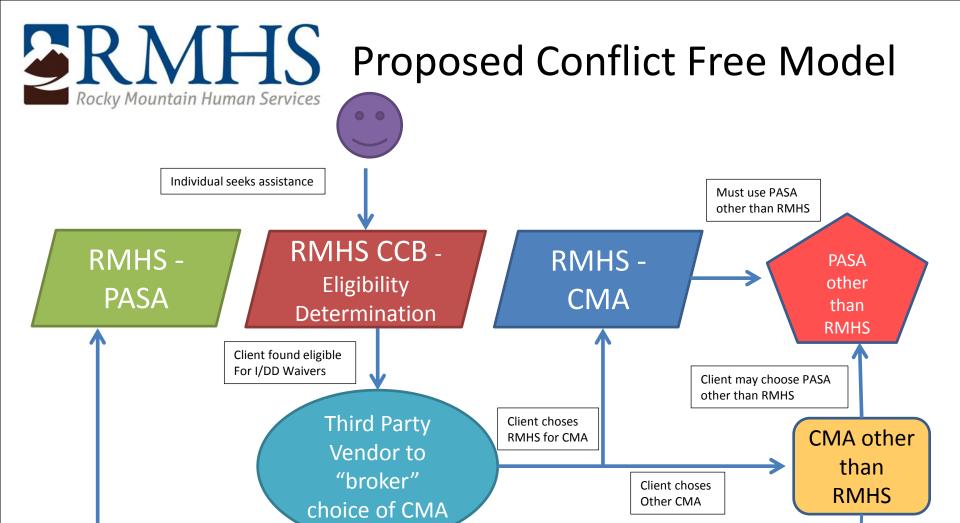
Legislative Update

- Conflict Free Case Management
 - Creates 3 Entities (CCB, CMA, PASA)
 - Defines roles at a high level
 - Holds \$ from cash fund to cover state expenses
 - Creates a 3rd party mechanism for choice
 - Requires rules on specific topics
 - Addresses rural area capacity
 - Establishes timelines

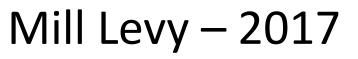

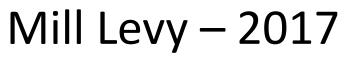

Finance Committee Report





April YTD Financial Results

- Completed on May 18^{th} V
- Revenues excluding Mill Levy are on budget V
 - Third party insurance offsetting Medicaid shortfalls
 - Mill Level spending is under budget \$1.5mil overhead savings/lag in new spending
 - Total revenues 4.3% under budget
- Total expenses are 5.0% under budget V
 - \$1,559k under budget is due to \$897k in staffing savings, \$708k in overhead savings (includes some staffing savings)
 - Surplus is \$180k over budget achieved FY17 budget



FY17 Wrap Up

- Received approval on new major Mill Levy project from DHS and expect to see April/May bump in new Mill Levy project spending from recent contracts and added family distributions
- Working to get some budgeted IT work done by June 30th
- Capacity building funds to help with
 - Recruitment
 - Retention
 - Client service
 - Billing systems
- Closing out two Veteran's programs consolidating Colorado Springs offices



Balance Sheet April 30, 2017



- Cash held up despite revalidation issues
- Receivables are netted against Medicaid advances
 - Lost some level of quality in receivables
- Debt continues to decline
 Currently at \$12.0 million
- Net equity turned positive in March
 - Now exceeds \$250k

Financial Auditors

- *Kundinger, Corder & Engle, P.C.* completed last year's audit on time. Finance Committee and Board of Directors were pleased with the timeliness and the quality of the audit
- KCE has offered to do audits for a slight fee reduction from FY16 rate
- The Board approves engaging Kundinger, Corder & Engle, P.C. for the FY17 financial and A-133 audits



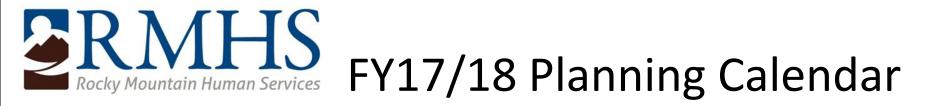


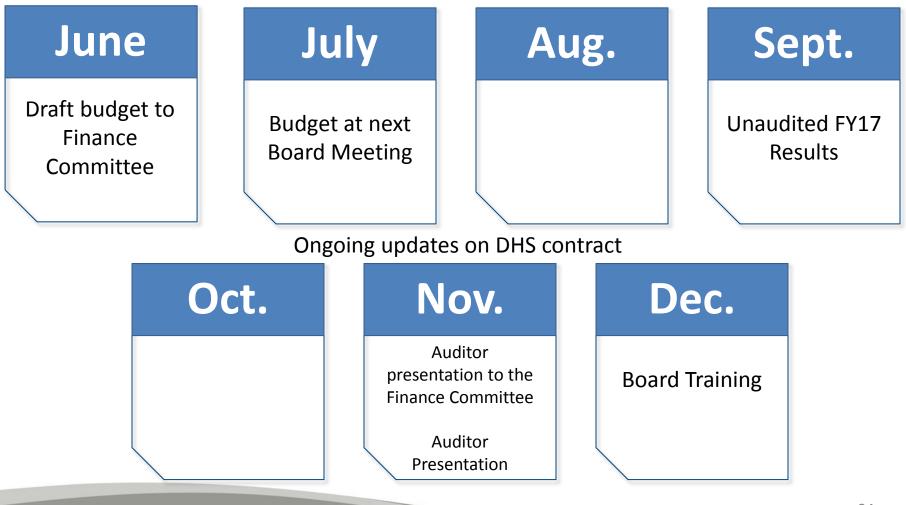
- In 2012, RMHS took out a \$1.0 million line of credit, which was renewed multiple times and changed to a term loan in June of 2016 with a 36 month amortization and a balloon payment due August 1, 2017.
- Colorado Business Bank has agreed to extend the payment at the same monthly rate so that the loan is paid on or before June 1, 2019.
- The Board authorizes the Executive Director and CFO to execute the necessary documents to extend the loan



Corporate Insurance

- All insurance coverage renewed May 15th
- IMA is our insurance broker presented to Finance Committee earlier this year. Rebid significant parts of the policies but stayed with existing insurance companies.
- Philadelphia Insurance initially declined to renew D&O
- With documentation of governance improvements offered higher limits
- State requirements required some increased coverage
