#### MOMENTUM OVERVIEW

- Program originated in 2013 to support state institutes
  - Youth were added to the criteria in 2017
- State-wide support for individuals transitioning from various behavioral health settings to community living, supporting barriers to discharge
- Services we provide
  - Care Management
  - Peer Support
  - Care Planning to support discharge and successful outpatient care
  - Wrap-around funding for items not covered by other sources





#### HIGH DEMAND, LOW RESOURCES

- Colorado ranks 42<sup>nd</sup> in the US for pediatric mental health with high rates of BH disorders and low rates of access to care
- Prior to the pandemic 20% of youth had a mental health diagnosis
- During the pandemic we saw increased ED visits, lack of resources and increased mental health diagnoses
- Youth Referrals
  - Prior to COVID (3/19-2/20): 100 clients
  - During COVID (3/20-2/21): 217 clients



#### LOOKING FORWARD

- \$500k in funding dedicated to eliminate our youth waitlist
- Funding supports unique person-centered solutions
- "Adam's" Story
- Advocacy- sharing data with OBH and others about gaps in the system

### Pending Vaccine Policy

- Analyzing various orders from executive branches

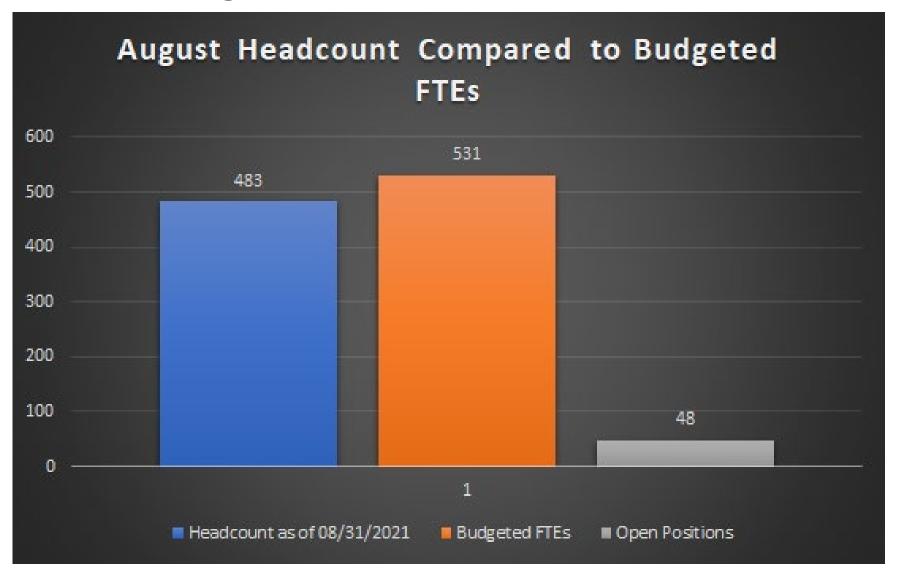


#### Unduplicated Census Trend



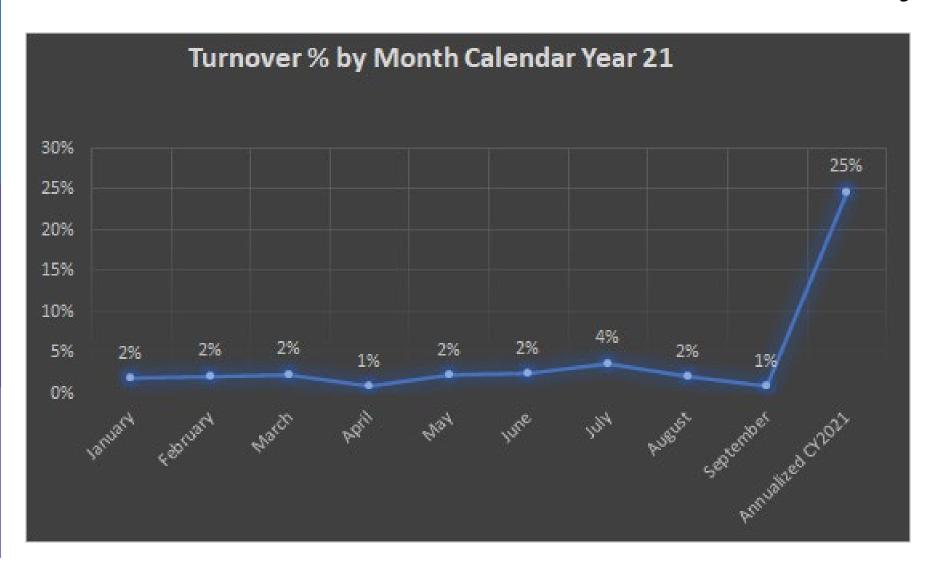


#### August Headcount Compared to FTEs
