

Your Voting Rights in Colorado

A Simple Guide for Voters with Disabilities

Your Vote Matters

You have the right to vote privately, independently, and with the accommodations best for you.



2026 Midterms Election

Tuesday, November 3, 2026

Vote by mail or in person. It's your choice.

Know Your Voting Rights

- 1 Use an accessible voting location.** Voting locations must be accessible and have accessible voting machines.
- 2 Vote by mail.** Colorado automatically mails a ballot to every active registered voter. You do **not** need to request an absentee ballot.
- 3 Get help voting.** You may ask an election judge or choose someone to assist you. The person helping you cannot pressure you or tell you how to vote.
- 4 Bring your service animal.** Your service animal may accompany you at a voting location.
- 5 Take the time you need.** Colorado's standard 15-minute voting-booth limit does not apply to voters with disabilities who would like additional time.
- 6 Use an electronic ballot.** Eligible voters with disabilities may access and mark an electronic ballot from home. Learn more on Secretary of State's [Accessible Voting page](#) on the website.

Important Dates

October 2 - 9

Mail ballots are sent to active registered voters. Check your mailing address and ballot status at [GoVoteColorado.gov](https://govotecolorado.gov).

October 12

Ballot drop boxes begin accepting mail ballots. Visit [GoVoteColorado.gov](https://govotecolorado.gov) for nearby locations.

October 26

Last day to register or update your registration online and still receive a ballot by mail. You can register and vote in person through Election Day.

November 3

ELECTION DAY. Voter Service and Polling Centers are open 7 a.m. – 7 p.m. Ballots must be received by your county clerk by **7 p.m.**

Need Help?

You do not need to figure it out alone. Ask an election judge for assistance or contact your county clerk with questions about voting, accessibility, or accommodations.
